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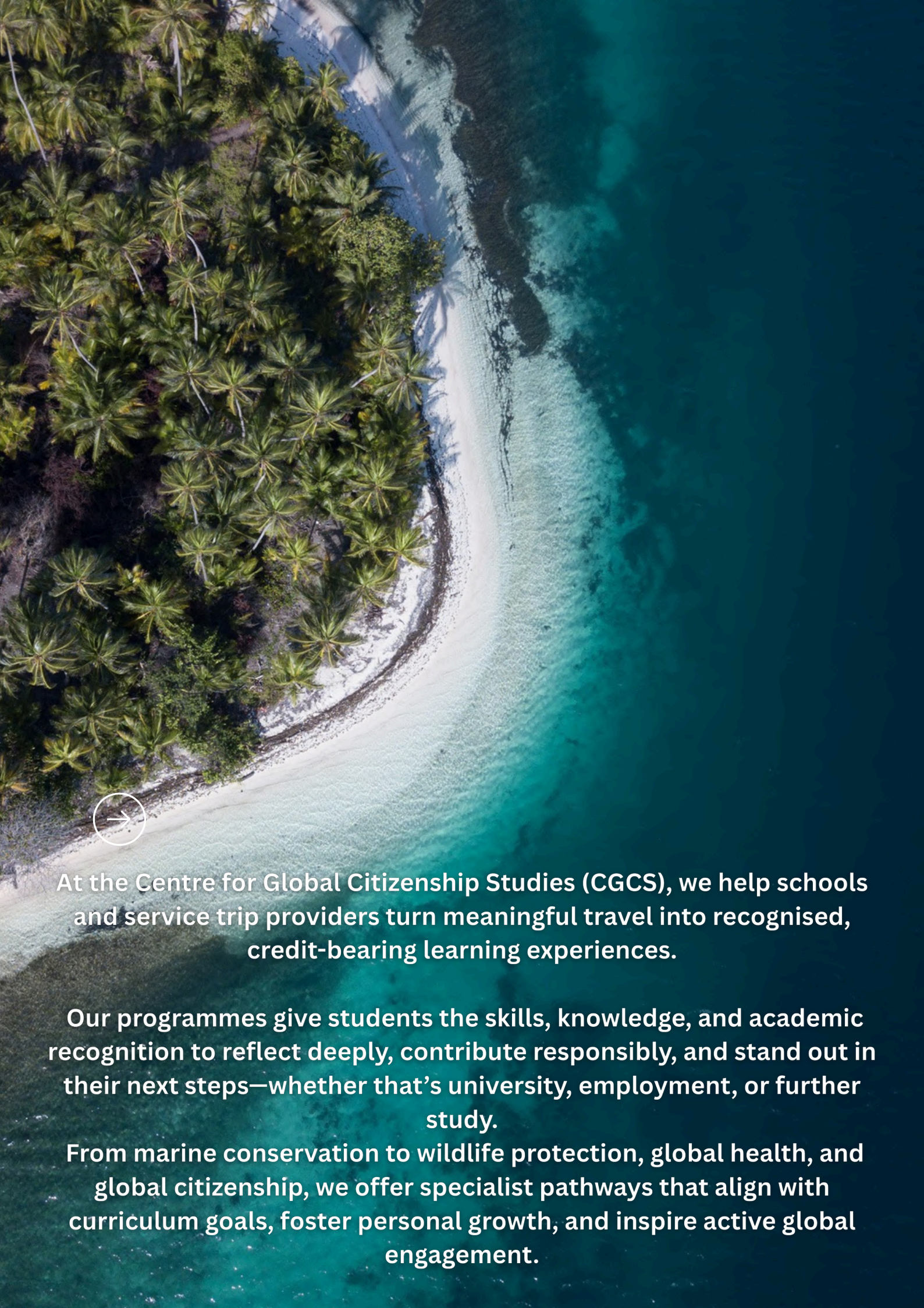

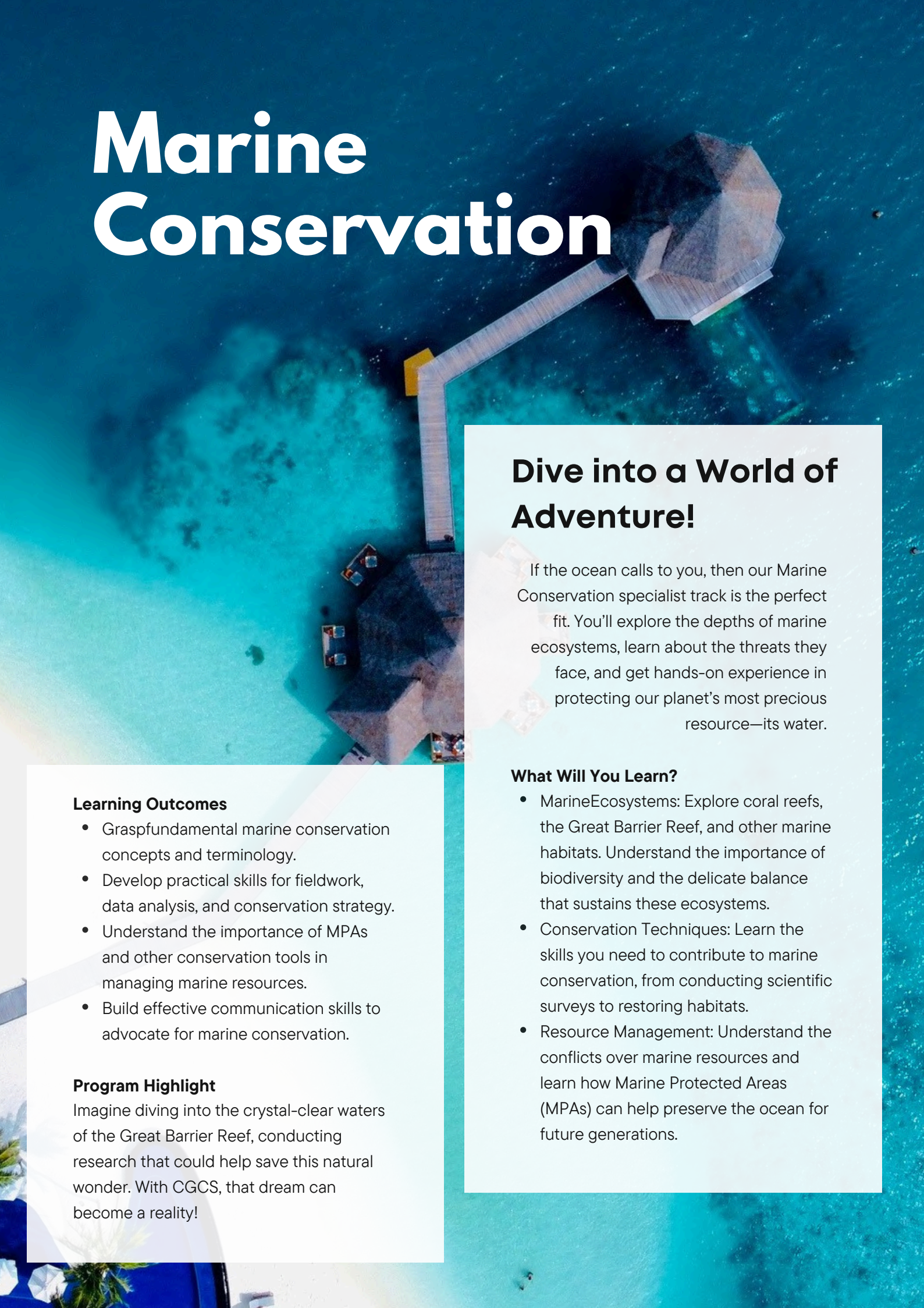

Marine Conservation

Step 2 – Specialise (Pre-trip learning)

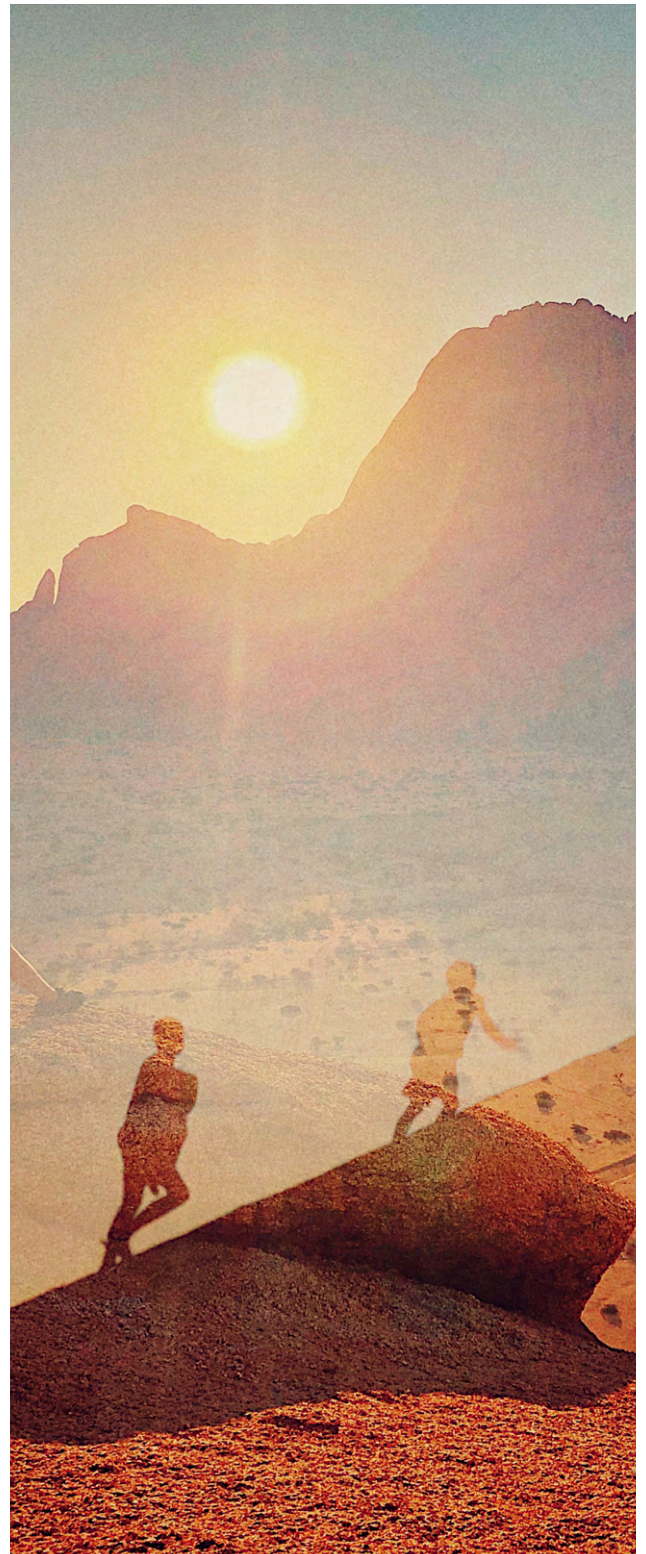
Dive into your chosen track—Marine, Wildlife, Global Citizenship, or Global Health—and develop the expertise needed to make a tangible difference in the field.

Credit Transfer: Making Your Learning Count



Recognizing Your Achievements

At CGCS, we value the hard work you put into your studies and experiences. Our Diploma in International Volunteering is not just a qualification—it can also be a stepping stone to further academic opportunities.

What is Credit Transfer?

- Credit transfer allows you to apply the credits you've earned in this program towards another program at a different institution, helping you advance more quickly in your academic journey.

How It Works

- **Earned Credits:** Complete our Diploma (41 UK CATS credits) and gain a qualification recognised across major credit systems as well as 16 UCAS points.
- **Global Recognition:**
 - **Europe (ECTS):** 20 – 21 ECTS credits
 - **US Semester Hours:** 9 Transferable US credits
- **Consult First:** Always check with your chosen institution's admissions office to confirm how they'll apply these credits.

Why Transfer Credits?

- **Advance Your Studies:** Enter degree programmes with advanced standing—potentially saving months or even a full year of study.
- **Broaden Your Options:** Leverage your credits for study abroad or to join international pathways.

Steps to Transfer Your Credits

1. **Complete Your Diploma:** Finish the program and earn your credits.
2. **Get Your Transcript:** Request your transcript from CGCS.
3. **Consult Your New Institution:** Discuss the credit transfer process with your new school.
4. **Submit Your Application:** Provide your transcript and other required documents.

Optional: Official US Transcript from Hartwick College

For added certainty when transferring US credits, you may order an official transcript issued by our US School of Record, Hartwick College, for USD 800. This transcript provides direct verification of your US credit equivalencies.
